

The Public Private Partnership was established in 2011, the RAH is a partnership between Celsus and SA Health.

Celsus financed, designed, constructed, and now operates non-clinical services at the RAH.

The RAH provides state of the art social infrastructure to the people of South Australia (SA).

The RAH achieved commercial acceptance on 13 June 2017.

The site contains almost 4 hectares of landscaped parks and internal green space



The RAH as a Green Project

The RAH was awarded 4 Star Green Star - Healthcare As Built rating by the GBCA in recognition of its sustainable design and construction as well as its operation and fit out.

- The key sustainability elements of the RAH are:
- water conservation through rainwater harvesting for non-potable use;
- energy efficient fittings;
- a co-generation system that turns waste heat into energy;
- the use of responsible materials;
- · water sensitive landscape design; and
- water and power metering to track and report consumption.




